Here to help place jobs

BANYULE job hunters are in luck with the opening of a free recruitment, training and employment service in Heidelberg.

Job Prospects, a division of the non-profit Service to Youth Council (SYC), hit town after winning a competitive tender run by the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations.

The Federal Government announced it would overhaul its job placement service earlier this year, and replace the old Job Network with Jobs Services Australia, a "one-stop shop" providing job seekers with a more personalised service.

With unemployment figures forecast to reach 8.5 per cent, Job Prospects chief executive Paul Edginton said the new service would offer crucial support for job seekers as well as employers.

"We are confident our presence in the area will improve unemployment rates," Mr Edginton said.

"We look forward to connecting local job seekers with local employers."

SYC marketing and communications manager Sarah Poppy said Job Prospects would work with job seekers to "build their confidence and skills to get into the workforce".

"This includes job search techniques, job applications, resumes and interview skills, and we can also help them get work experience," Ms Poppy said.
